In this powerful chapter, Pastor Oneka speaks of the incredible story of Elijah and Elisha from:

2 Kings 2

To recap: As Elijah's mentee, Elisha requested a double share (or portion) of Elijah's spirit and to become his successor. Elisha replied that he would receive his request as long as he was present when Elijah was taken away. As Pastor Oneka beautifully put it,

" keep your eyes on me and keep your eyes on God's presence."
