"Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work." - 2 Corinthians 9:7-8

In God's story of His love for humanity, He gave what He decided in His heart to give, which was Jesus. He never reluctantly or under compulsion chose to sacrifice His son so we could be reunited with Him. God went first to show us how to live out 2 Corinthians 9:7-8. He gave everything and because of that, we have been blessed abundantly so that in all things and at all times, we have all that we need.

As we are fasting and praying, reflect on this area. How are we living? With a closed fist or an open hand? Together, let's ask God to illuminate the areas of our lives where we have given reluctantly and ask Him to show us how we can be cheerful givers.

READ:

Luke 10:25-37
